- being involved in school-based planning
- sharing ideas and information with other school councils and provincial organizations
- communicating information to the school community and other school councils

• setting policies that relate to school council functions, such as: location of school council

meetings mail, email address for school council correspondence school council orientation and development financial management and/or

fundraising communications privacy minutes of school council meetings pertinent information unique to the school council
